CENTER MORICHES, NY APRIL 4, 2012

The Board of Education, Center Moriches Union Free School District, held a Regular Meeting in the High School Auditorium on Wednesday, April 4, 2012. Those present were Board Members Joseph W. McHeffey, Wendy R. Turkington, Thomas R. Hogan, and Heather Schaub-Magill; Superintendent Russell J. Stewart, Deputy Superintendent Lynda G. Adams, Business Official Carol M. Perkins, District Treasurer Diane M. Smith and District Clerk Patricia A. Galietta. Mr. Finnegan was absent.

President McHeffey called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:11 with the Pledge of Allegiance. There were approximately 60 visitors present.

1. Superintendent's Report

- Recognition of 2011-2012 Athletes & Coaches County Legislator Edward Romaine presented County Proclamations to the Boys' Class B, Class BCD, and Long Island Champions Basketball team and the Girls' Soccer Class B County Champions and Mr. Thode and Coach Thomas and Miller (Boys' Basketball), Coach Brady and Semisa (Girls' Soccer) and Coach Fournier (Girls' Cross Country Class C County Champions) presented their respective teams with plaques in recognition of their successful seasons.
- 2012-2013 Budget Presentation Mr. Stewart reviewed the budget process as it has evolved since March, highlighting District growth (enrollment in 2004-05 was 1267 students and has risen to 1742 students in 2011-12). Mr. Stewart reviewed the expenses and income for the district and the proposed budget, which will increase the tax levy by 4.90%, and leave the district's programs intact. Mr. McHeffey spoke about the budget and changes made by the State (tax cap), the need for a super majority (60% of the vote) required to pass a budget that exceeds the tax cap (for Center Moriches the tax cap is 2.95%), and what non-mandated cuts would have to be made to reach a 0% increase, should the budget not pass in two votes. Mr. McHeffey also discussed the transportation proposition.

WHEREAS, in 1995, amendments were made to the SEQRA Regulation (Part 617) to classify projects, which will be excluded from the requirements for the preparation of an Environmental Impact

Statement (Type II actions). The projects mentioned above are now classified as Type II actions as determined by 6NYCRR§617.5 and

WHEREAS, these projects fall under the following categories:

A. Routine Maintenance and Repair 6NYCRR§617.5 (c)(1): Maintenance or repair involving no substantial change in an existing facility.

B. Replace or Rehabilitation 6NYCRR§617.5 (c)(2): Replacement or rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, unless the word exceeds a threshold for a Type I action in 6NYCRR§617.5.

THEREFORE, as the lead agency for the SEQRA determination, all the above-reference projects fall under Categories "A," "B," or "C" above. The procedure for Type II actions, with regard to the SEQRA Process for Capital Projects noted above is "<u>No Additional Required Action Under 6NYCRR§617.5(a)</u>."

13. Donations
