REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION

CENTER MORICHES, NY JULY 07, 2005

The Board of Education, Center Moriches Union Free School District, held its Reorganizational Meeting in the Board Room on Thursday, July 07, 2005 at 6:30 p.m. Those present were Board Members Joseph W. McHeffey, Virginia J. Tyson and Wendy Turkington; Board Members Elect Daniel E. Finnegan and Wayne A. Vitale; Superintendent Donald A. James, School Business Official Karen Occhiogrosso, District Treasurer Carol A. Snyder and District Clerk Patricia A. Galietta.

The Reorganizational Meeting was called to order by temporary chairperson Patricia A. Galietta at 6:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 3 visitors present.

1. Administration of Oath/Election of Officers

A. Administration of Oath to Newly Elected Board Member:

The constitutional oath of office was administered and signed by the newly elected Board members, Daniel Finnegan and Wayne Vitale, after which they officially began their new terms as members of the Board of Education, July 01, 2005 – June 30, 2008.

B. Election of President of the Board of Education

On motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 4-0 (Mr. McHeffey abstained), Mr. Joseph McHeffey was elected President of the Board of Education for the 2005-2006 school year.

The constitutional oath of office was administered to and signed by Mr. McHeffey as President of the Board of Education and Mr. McHeffey assumed the chair.

C. Election of Vice President of the Board of Education

On motion by Mrs. Turkington, seconded by Mr. Finnegan and carried 4-0 (Mrs. Tyson abstained), Mrs. Tyson was elected Vice President of the Board of Education for the 2005-2006 school year and the following resolution adopted:

"Resolved, that in the absence of the President of the Board of Education or his/her inability to act, the Vice President of the Board of Education will act as President and be authorized to assume all of the responsibilities and perform all of the duties of the President of the Board of Education as provided by law; and

Be it further resolved, that the constitutional oath of office be signed by the newly elected Vice President of the Board of Education after which the Vice President assumes office."

2. Appointment of Officers

A. District Clerk

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to appoint Patricia A. Galietta as District Clerk for the 2005-2006 school year at a stipend of \$5,600. Mrs. Galietta signed the constitutional oath.

B. Deputy District Clerk

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to Catherine Mahoney as Deputy District Clerk to serve in the absence of the District Clerk for the 2005-2006 school year.

C. District Treasurer

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to appoint Carol A. Snyder as Treasurer and Chief Accounting Officer and the custodian of all monies belonging to the District from whatever source derived, during the 2005-2006 school year at a stipend of \$4,500. Mrs. Snyder signed to oath of office.

D. Deputy Treasurer

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to appoint Rosemary Smith as Deputy Treasurer for the 2005-2006 school year, to assist the Treasurer and to serve in the absence of the Treasurer, at a stipend of \$1,300.

E. Independent Internal Auditor

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to authorize the continuation of the Board of Education's Independent Internal Auditor, James Ryan, and authorize the payment of monthly bills as soon as audited by the Internal Auditor and found to be correct; such payments to be formalized by Board of Education approval of the related warrants presented each month at a stipend of \$4,500.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Center Moriches School District hereby adopts the coverage provided by §18 of the New York State Public Officers Law for the following job titles: Board of Education Members, Superintendent of Schools, School Business Official, School District Treasurer and Business Office Manager, Records Retention Officer, High School Principal, High School Assistant Principal, Middle School Principal, Elementary School Principal, Athletic Director, Director of Special Education, Deputy Treasurer and Secretary to the Business Officer, and Secretary to the Superintendent of Schools. The adoption of this provision is intended to supplement and not supplant the protection available to such employees by virtue of already existing statutory provisions or other sources. Such coverage shall include but not be limited to being called to testify as a witness or to answer questions concerning their acts or omissions within the scope of their office, agency or employment before a Grand Jury, the Office of the District Attorney, or other law enforcement official. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize or require defense or indemnification to a member of the Board of Education, the Superintendent of Schools, School Business Official, School District Treasurer and Business Office Manager, Records Retention Officer, High School Principal, High School Assistant Principal, Middle School Principal, Elementary School Principal, Athletic Director, Director of Special Education, Deputy Treasurer and Secretary to the Business Officer, Secretary to the Superintendent of Schools, or who has been identified as a defendant in a pending criminal prosecution, or where such individual or the school district has reason to believe that such individual is a target in a criminal investigation or prosecution by the Office of the District Attorney or other law enforcement entity. This benefit shall not be available to and shall not cover any employee serving in any of the job titles listed herein who is represented for collective bargaining purposes by a duly designated collective bargaining agent unless and until such coverage is negotiated with the collective bargaining agent representing said employee. The Superintendent or his designee shall take steps necessary to obtain insurance protection against the potential liability to the District arising

out of the adoption of this provision.

PROGRAM SECTION

19. Creation of Committees

Citizens' advisory committees are helpful vehicles for effecting two-way communication. Accordingly, residents of the District who have demonstrated outstanding interest or are especially qualified because of training, experience or personal characteristics, shall be encouraged to participate in school affairs through membership on such committees.

Such persons should understand clearly that their role is advisory and that the final decisions rest with the Board. The charge to each special committee shall be outlined at the time of its creation and it shall be deemed dissolved when its report has been made and submitted, but not later than June 30th annually.

A) Curriculum & Instruction Advisory Committee

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to approve creation of the Curriculum & Instruction Advisory Committee.

As the Center Moriches School District continues its journey toward becoming more learningcentered, the truest measure of progress may also be the most difficult: assessing and documenting student learning. Assessment provides the means for accurately responding to the fundamental questions of the District: *How does this program, policy, or practice improve or expand student learning? How do we know?*

As outcomes are identified and defined and as activities to assist students in achieving those outcomes are developed, appropriate assessment methods must also be developed. By adopting ongoing, meaningful, and useful assessment strategies, the District supports the development of the culture of evidence necessary to accurately document student learning. This documentation becomes more meaningful when it includes clear evidence of student learning (e.g., instructor or student commentaries on learning achievements, samples of student work, external evaluations of student work and standardized assessment data). The basic premise is to conduct an analysis of what is currently being taught, map it against what needs to be taught to align with local and State standards, clarify what is meant by understanding, and explore a method of lesson design that results in enduring learning by students.

The Center Moriches Curriculum and Instruction Committee is charged with reviewing existing and proposed educational programs and curricula in order to make recommendations to the Board of Education regarding the feasibility of such programs from educational as well as fiscal standpoints. The committee will strive for efficiency while maintaining meaningful participation by all sectors (instructional and support staff, administration, parents and community members) of the District in the development of recommendations regarding the continuance, and when appropriate, dissolution of educational programs and curricula. They will utilize valid and balanced research to support said recommendations.

The purview of the committee encompasses all curricular and instructional matters in Kindergarten through grade 12 with specific areas of focus designated by the Board of Education and/or Superintendent of Schools yearly.

For the 2005-2006 School Year the Committee is charged with the following:

 Review literacy, mathematics and technology benchmarks and curriculum maps Kindergarten through grade 12 and make recommendations to the Board of Education and Superintendent regarding the adoption of such on or before June 30, 2006;

 Research the implications of increased class sizes at the elementary and secondary levels and make recommendations regarding such to the Board of Education on or before April 30, 2006; and

Review value added instructional programs and make recommendations to the Board of Education on or before April 30, 2006, regarding the continuation and, when appropriate, the discontinuance of said programs.

B) Facilities Advisory Committee

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mrs. Tyson, seconded by Mrs. Turkington and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to approve creation of the Facilities Advisory Committee.

This Committee will work to help the District contain or reduce operating expenses (i.e., heat/electric, etc.), align its recommendations so that the Board's goal of addressing facilities concerns are met, and present its recommendations on or before April 30, 2006, for consideration in the budget for the 2006-2007 school year.

- (c) The Notes are not issued in renewal of other notes.
- (d) The total amount of such taxes remains uncollected at the date of adoption of this resolution.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Notes hereby authorized shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and shall be general obligations of the District, and the faith and credit of the District are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes and unless the Notes are otherwise paid or payment provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget of the District and a tax sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

<u>Section 4</u>. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and the Law, and pursuant to Section 50.00, 56.00, 60.00 and 61.00 of the Law, the power to sell and issue the Notes authorized pursuant hereto, or any renewals thereof, and to determine the terms, form and contents, including the manner of execution, of such Notes, and to execute arbitrage certifications relative thereto, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.
