#### **Proposition #1**

#### **RESOLVED:**

(a) That the Board of Education of the Center Moriches Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct additions, alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and the sites thereof, and to expend therefor an amount not to exceed \$18,850,000; (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$18,850,000 to finance said cost, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by said Board of Education, and (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the amount of \$18,850,000 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

### **Proposition #2**

## **RESOLVED:**

(a) **THAT IN THE EVENT BOND PROPOSITION NO. 1 IS APPROVED**, the Board of Education of the Center Moriches Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct a new turf field at the Secondary Campus and to expend therefor an amount not to exceed \$1,050,000; (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$1,050,000 to finance said cost, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by said Board of Education, (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the amount of \$1,050,000 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, and (d) that if this Bond Proposition No. 2 is approved, it shall become effective only in the event that Bond Proposition No. 1 is approved.
