- Budget Development Calendar The order of presentations for the Budget process was discussed, possibly changing the staffing requirement to the beginning of the presentations.
- Middle School Mid-Term Testing Mrs. Bates, Mr. Turnow and Mrs. Cohen made a presentation to the Board concerning the recommendation of the Middle School Mid-term Testing Committee that mid-terms be eliminated in the Middle School. The Committee feels that students are already over-tested, and because half-days for testing have been eliminated, mid-terms could stretch out to the end of January, resulting in a great deal of instruction time being lost. Faculty members would rather spend that time teaching. Members of the School Board supported the recommendation.
